On the radar: ZAGREB

Once just a whistle-stop on the Orient-Express line, Zagreb is evolving into a must-see destination in its own right, with several new cultural attractions. The expansive **Contemporary Art Museum** (www.msu.hr) is drawing crowds with Carsten Höller's sculptural slides (pictured), while **Lauba House** (www.lauba.hr), which opened this summer, styles itself as a laboratory for art experiments and cultural innovation, and is also home to the private Filip Trade Collection of Croatian contemporary artists. Zagrebians nostalgically await the spring reopening of the outdoor **Summer Cinema Tuškanac**, in the Tuškanac forest, after a three-decade closure. Indoors, the city's caffeine culture percolates at **Eli's Caffé** (www.eliscaffé.com) with three-time national barista champion Nik Orosi at the helm. And **Hotel President Pantovčak** (www.president-zagreb.com; doubles from US\$142) invites guests to sleep soundly among the objets d'art selected by its architect owner. **KIMBERLEY LOVATO**
